Summary

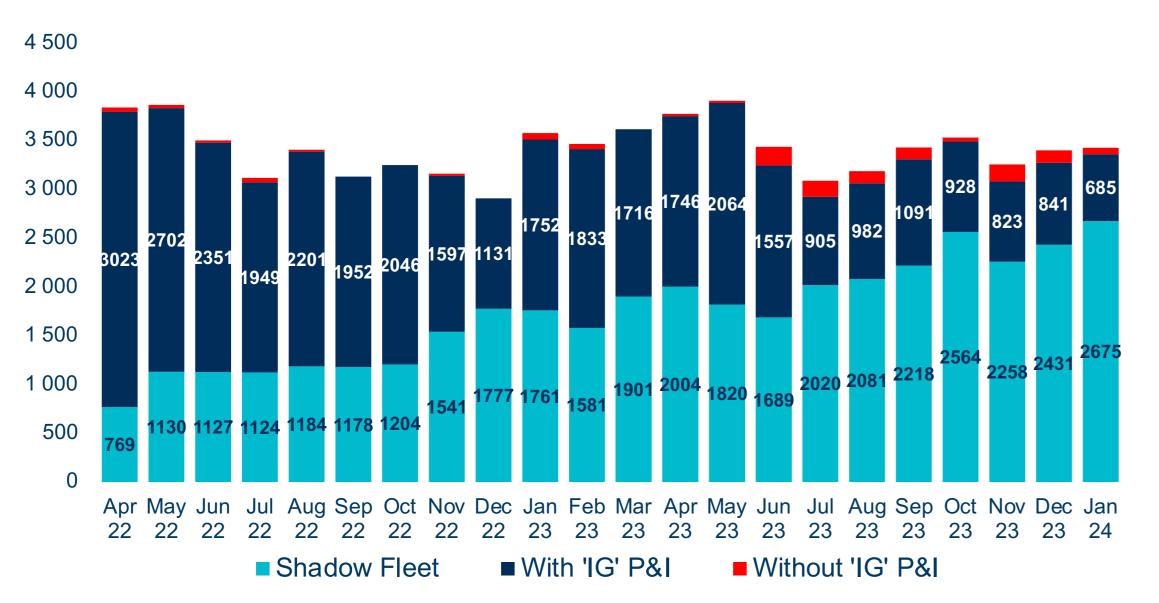
- In January 2024, Russian seaborne oil exports volumes remained stable, while the total oil export revenues increased modestly by \$0.3 bn to \$15.6 bn, driven by slight gains of all Russian crude grades.
- Reliance on Western maritime services decreased further only 20% of crude and 51% of oil products were shipped with IG P&I insurance coverage.
- KSE Institute estimates 211 loaded Russian shadow fleet tankers left Russian ports (inc. 2 involved in STS transfers) in January 2024, 83% of which older than 15 years. Russian shadow fleet poses huge environmental risks for the EU as decrepit tankers without P&I insurance navigate several European countries coastlines including Danish Straits. In January 2024, the shadow fleet was responsible for exports of around 2.7 mb/d of crude and 1.0 mb/d of oil products.
- India remains the biggest buyer of Russian seaborne crude despite a decrease of imports to ~1.6-1.7 mb/d in recent months since record high 2.2 mb/d in May. On the contrary, Turkey increased its total Russian oil imports to the record high 0.8-0.9 mb/d in recent months and remains the biggest buyer of Russian oil products with total imports of 504 kb/d in January.
- The US Treasury approach to designate individual vessels effectively hits the target by removing shadow tankers from regular commercial service. As of Feb 20, 2024, out of 27 sanctioned vessels 16 have been unloaded and had no scheduled voyages, 8 have been loaded but have not been moving, 3 indicated planned shipments with no final port of destination. On Feb 23, 2024, another 14 vessels, linked to Sovcomflot, were sanctioned.
- Russia attempts lowering effect of sanctions by transferring management of tankers from sanctioned to newly established entities. The UAE registered Sun Ship Management as of February manages only 4 out of 83 tankers it managed by July 15, 2023. Most of tankers were transferred to Oil Tankers Scf Mgmt Fzco (sanctioned in mid January), the latter has already transferred 4 tankers to a newly established UAE company Stream Ship Management Fzco.
- Significant price discounts for both Russian crude and oil products continue to support the strong demand for Russian oil exports. Average Urals FOB Baltic and Black Sea increased by 2.3/bbl and 2.5/bbl to around \$62/bbl, while ESPO FOB increased by \$1.4/bbl to \$73.6/bbl. The discount on FOB Baltic and Black Sea to Dated Brent little changed MoM but the discount of ESPO widened by around \$1/bbl in January.
- According to KSE Institute modelling, in the base case with current oil price caps and status quo of sanctions but their stronger enforcement, revenues will contract to \$156 bn and \$141 bn in 2024 and 2025 respectively compared to \$218 bn and estimated \$177 bn in 2022 and 2023 respectively. If the discount on Russian oil is widened to \$50/bbl compared to Brent forecast prices, revenues will fall to \$95 bn and \$61 bn in 2024 and 2025 respectively. However, in case of weak sanctions enforcement, Russian oil revenues could increase to the robust \$187 bn and \$181 bn in 2024 and 2025 respectively.



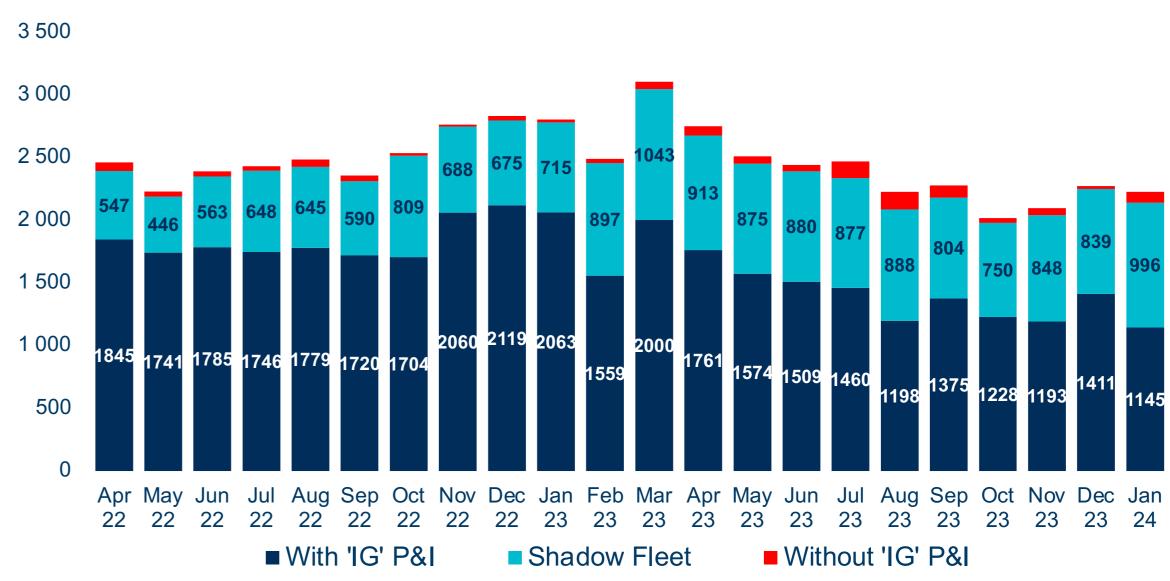
Russian seaborne oil exports volumes little changed in January 2024. Only 32% of Russian oil exports were shipped by IG insured tankers

- In January 2024 Russian seaborne oil exports little changed over previous month but were 11.4% lower YoY
- Shipments of seaborne crude oil increased by 0.7% MoM while products exports were 2.0% lower MoM
- Russia managed to further lower its reliance on Western maritime services both for crude and oil products shipments as 20% of crude oil and 51% of oil products were shipped by tankers with International Group (IG) P&I insurance coverage in January 2024

Exports of Russian oil products, kb/d

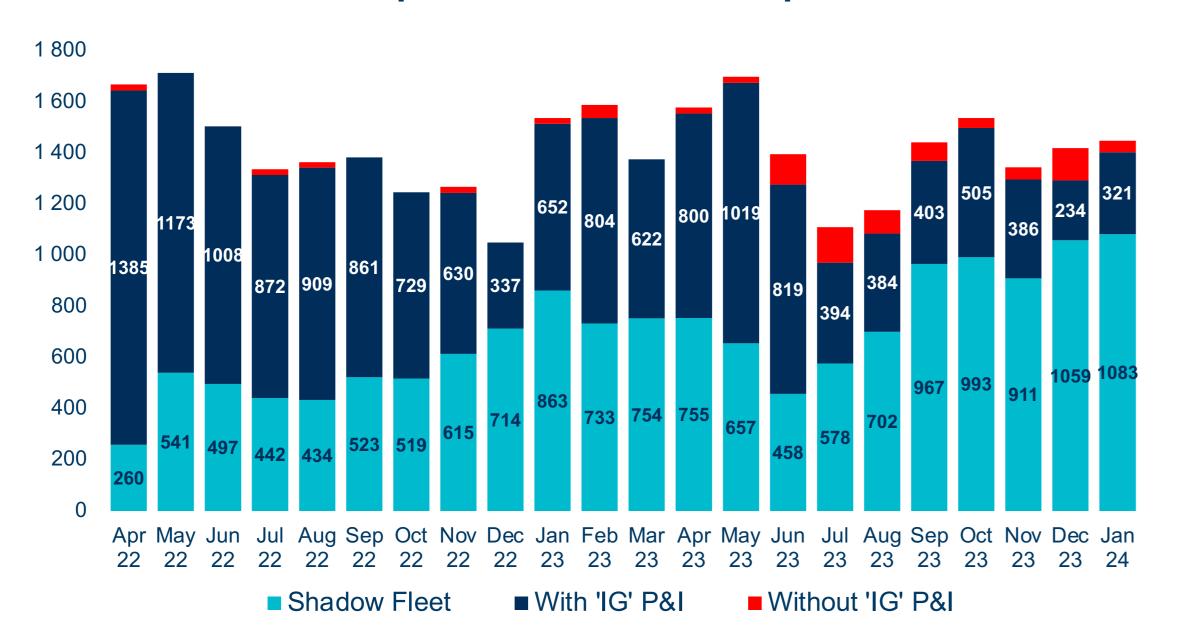




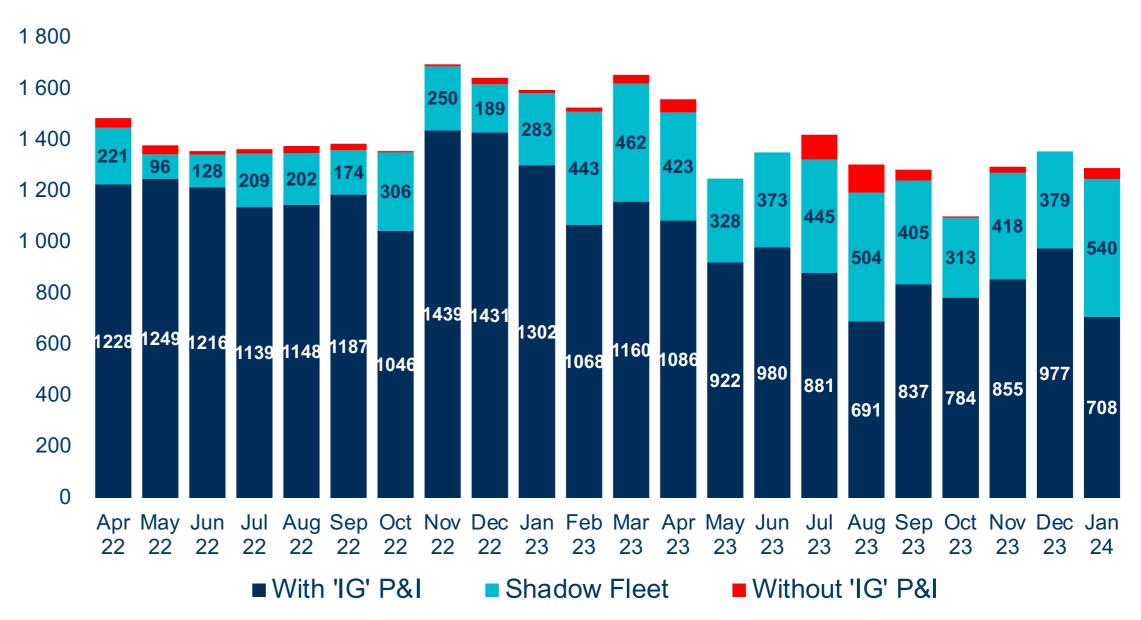
38% of crude & oil products were shipped by IG insured tankers from Baltic Sea ports in January 2024

- In January 2024 the exports of crude oil from Baltic ports increased by 2.0% MoM but were 5.8 % lower YoY
- The exports of oil products from Baltic ports decreased by 4.8% MoM and by 19.1% YoY
- 22% of crude oil and 55% of oil products were shipped by tankers with IG P&I insurance in January compared to 17% and 72% respectively in December 2023

Exports of Russian oil products from Baltic Sea ports, kb/d

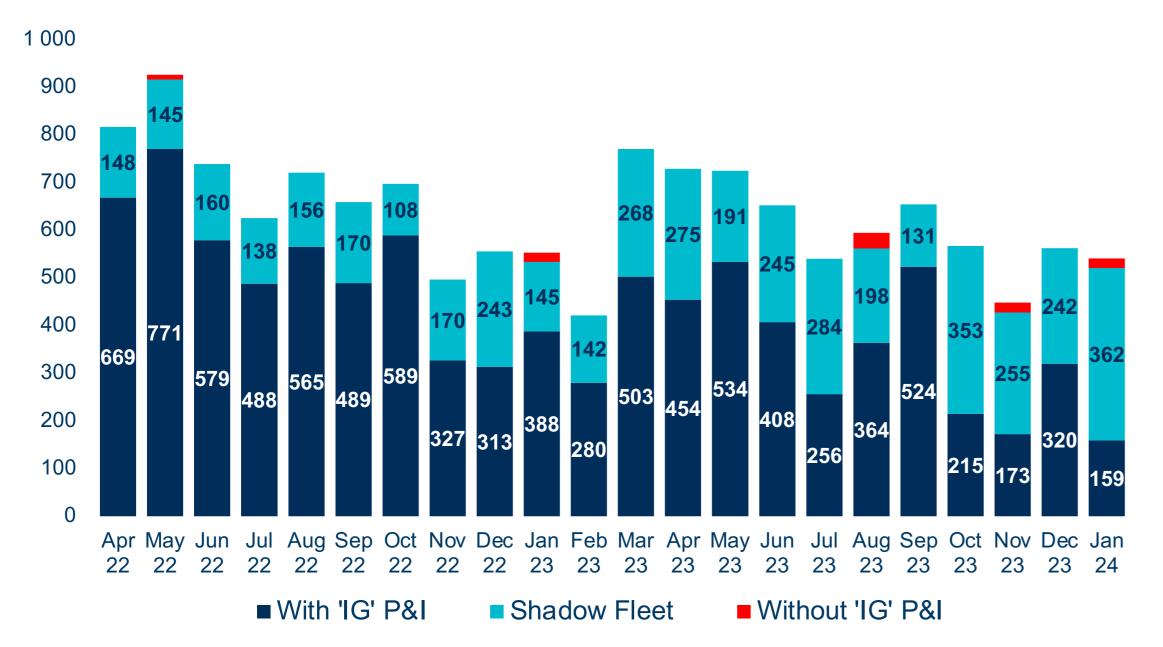




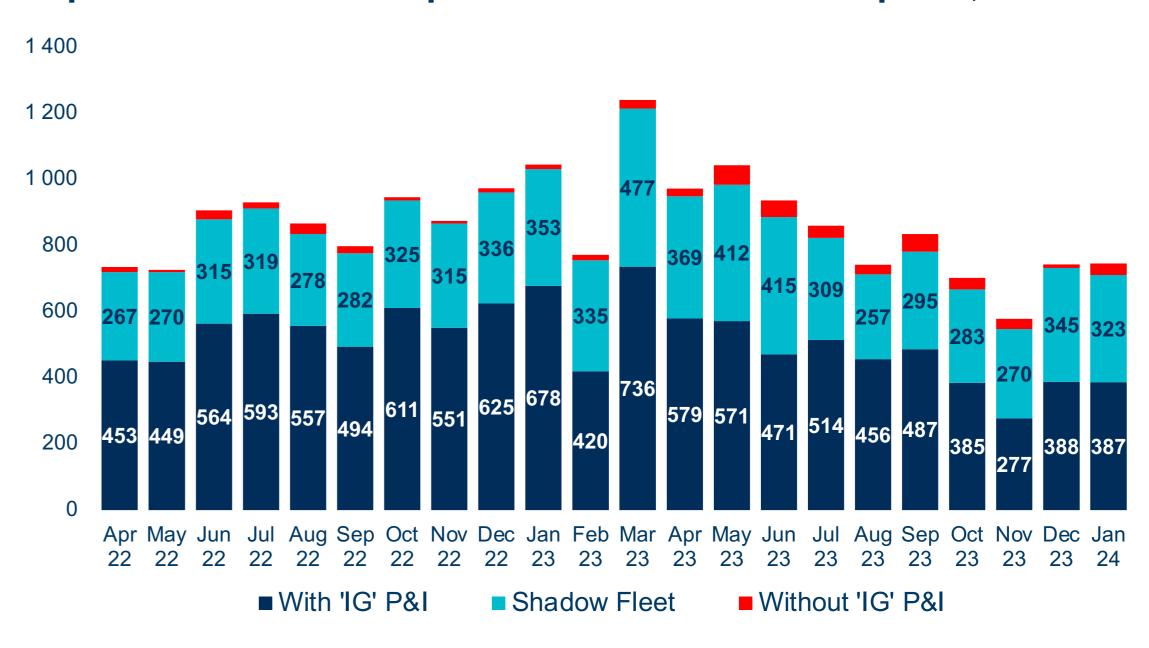
42% of crude & oil products were shipped by IG insured tankers from Black Sea ports in January 2024

- The exports of crude oil from Black Sea ports decreased 3.8% MoM and 2.2% YoY in January 2024
- The exports of oil products from Black Sea ports barely changed MoM but was 28.6% lower YoY
- 29% of crude oil and 52% of oil products were shipped by tankers with IG P&I insurance

Exports of Russian oil products from Black Sea ports, kb/d





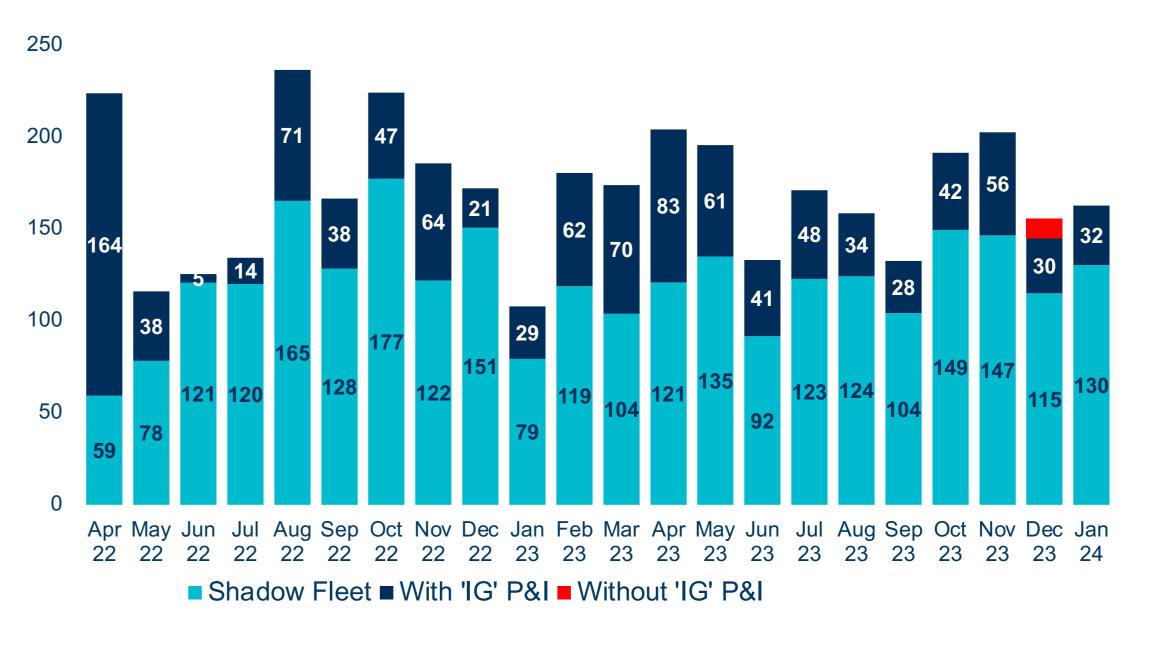
14% of crude oil & oil products were shipped by IG insured tankers from Pacific Ocean ports in January 2024

- In January 2024 the exports of crude oil from Pacific Ocean ports barely changed MoM but declined by 4.8% YoY
- The exports of oil products from Pacific Ocean ports increased by 4.5% MoM and by 50.9% YoY
- Only 13% of crude oil and 20% of oil products were shipped by tankers with P&I Club insurance in January 2024

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Exports of Russian oil products from Pacific Ocean ports, kb/d

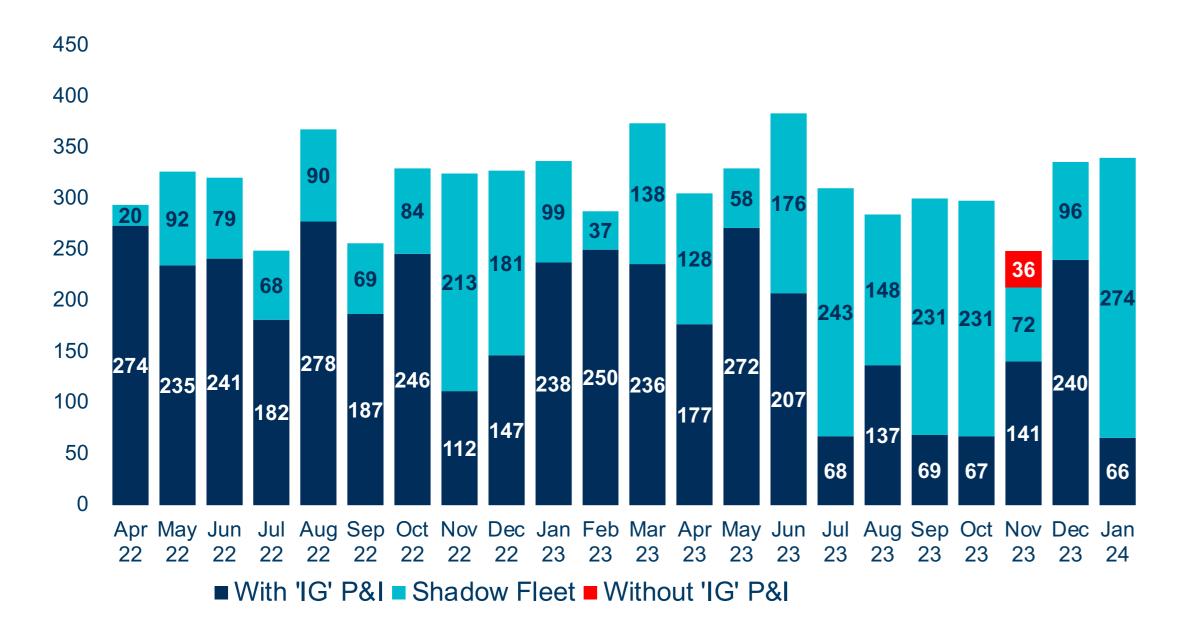




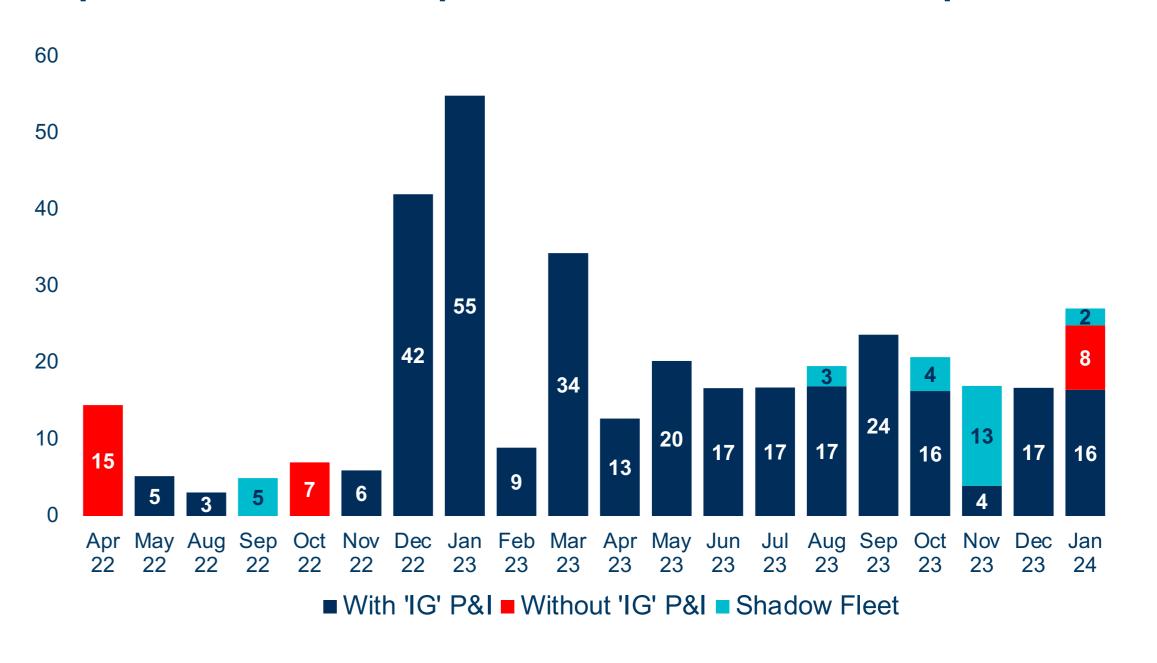
Only 22% of crude oil and oil products were shipped by IG insured tankers from Arctic Ocean ports in January 2024

- The exports of crude oil from Arctic Ocean ports little changed over previous month and over year in January 2024
- The exports of oil products from Arctic Ocean is insignificant as Russia ships predominantly crude from these ports
- 19% of crude oil was shipped by IG insured tankers in January 2024 compared to 71% in the previous month

Russian crude oil exports from Arctic Ocean ports, kb/d



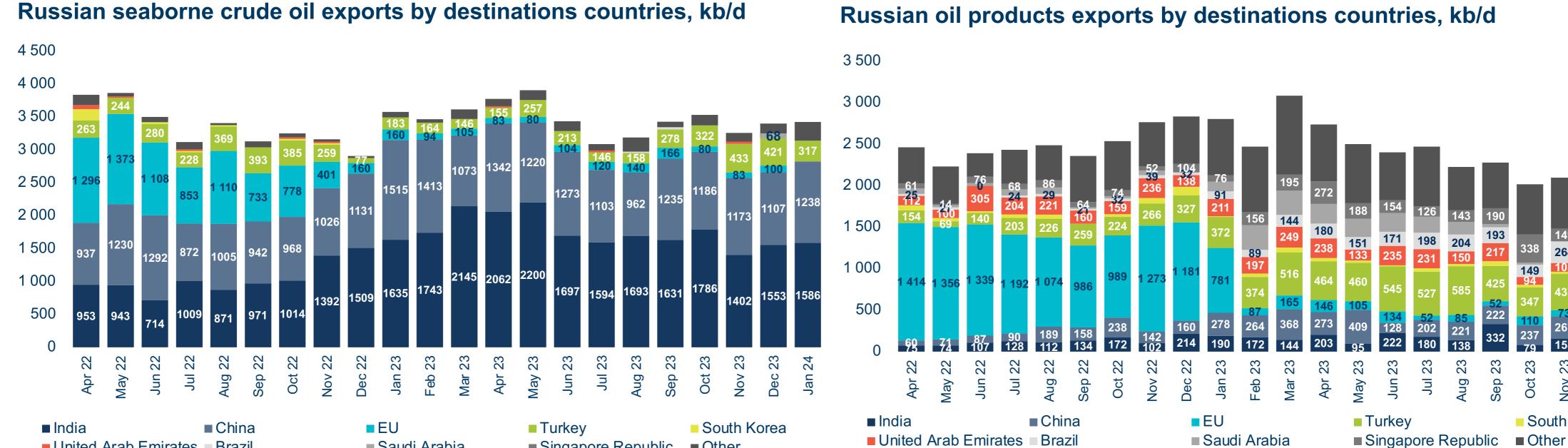
Exports of Russian oil products from Arctic Ocean ports, kb/d





India and Turkey remained the biggest Russian crude and oil products importers in January 2023

- EU countries did not import Russian crude in January 2024 while EU's share in Russian oil products exports was recorded at 4% in January 2024
- Altogether India, China and Turkey were responsible for 92% of Russian crude oil exports in January
- Russian seaborne crude exports to India barely changed and it remained the biggest seaborne Russian crude. The imports of Russian crude to China, second biggest Russian seaborne crude importer, increased by 131 kb/d or by 11.8%
- Russian oil exports to Turkey exceeded 800 kb/d for a third consecutive month. Turkey remains the biggest Russian oil products imports while crude imports exceed pre-invasion levels. Moreover, the country increased its reliance on Russian oil to around two-thirds of its energy demand which makes it very vulnerable from the energy security point of view

Sun Ship Management moved from second to seventh position in the list of ten biggest shippers after being sanctioned by the OFAC for carrying crude oil sold at a price above the price cap. It transferred almost entire tanker fleet to the Oil Tankers Scf Mgmt Fzc and other UAE registered companies (see slide 19).

Oil Tankers Scf Mgmt Fzc topped the list of ten biggest shippers for a second consecutive month by shipping around 18% of Russian crude in January.

Registered in Turkey Beks Tanker Isletmeciligi As topped the list of shippers of Russian oil products for the first time in January.

The previous leader, UAE.Oil Tankers Scf Mgmt Fzco moved to ninth position in the list even before the OFAC imposed sanctions on it on February 8, 2024.

Six out of ten biggest shippers of Russian oil products were Greek companies in January 2024 compared to three in December and five in November 2023.

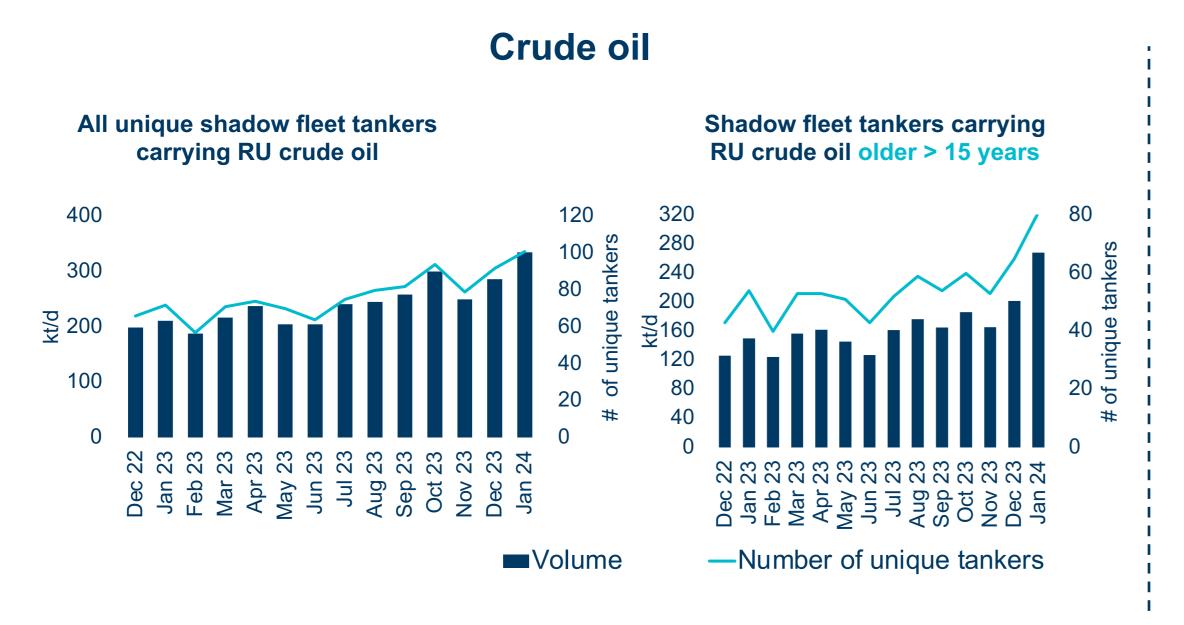

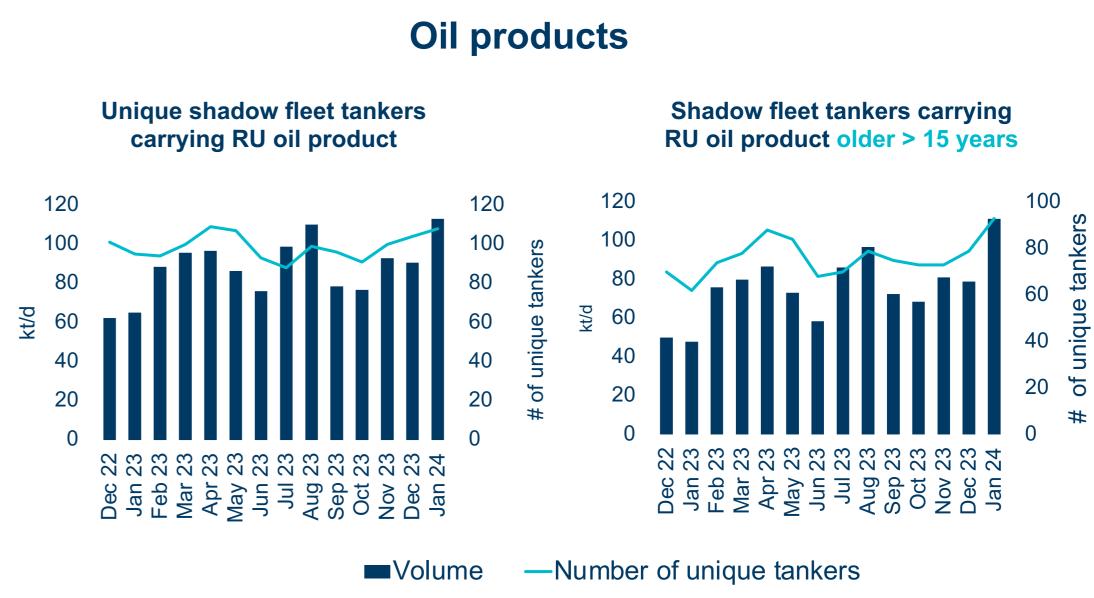

The number of Russian shadow fleet tankers carrying crude and oil products from Russian ports is estimated at 209 in January 2024

- Russian oil exporters increased the number of shadow fleet tankers carrying crude from Russian ports by 9 to 101 tankers in January 2024 while 80% of them were older than 15 years
- The number of shadow fleet tankers carrying Russian oil products from Russian ports increased by 4 to 108 in January 2024 while 86% of them were older than 15 years
- Having moved into the shadow, the tankers are not likely to be properly maintained and operated increasing the probability of environment catastrophe for which Russia will refuse to pay



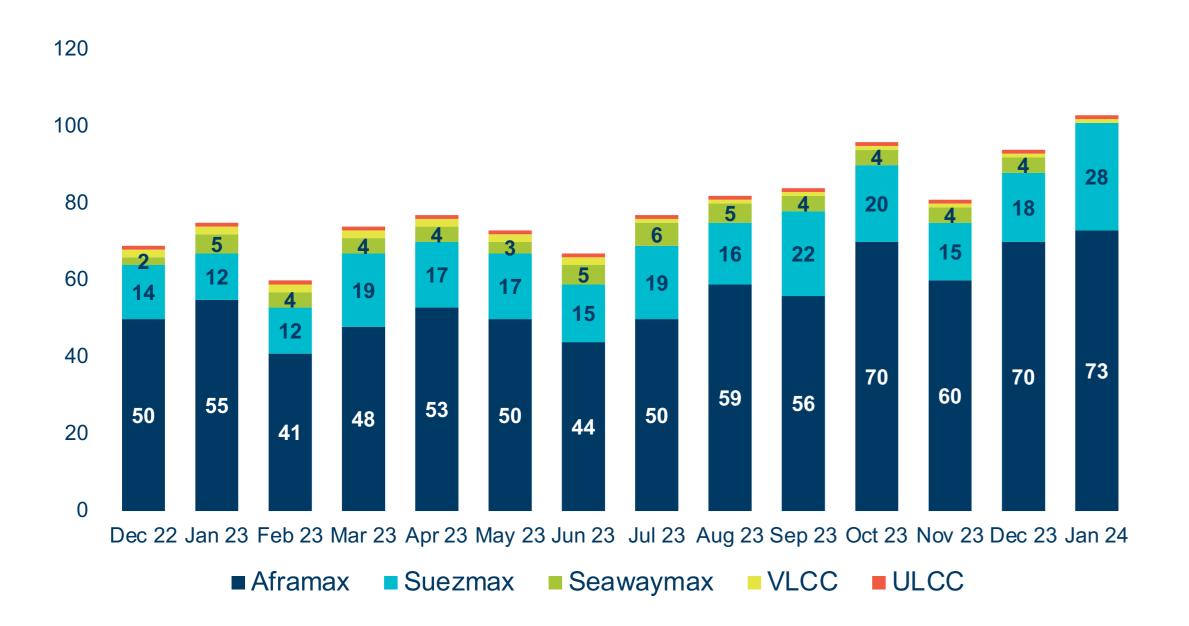




Aframax and Seuzmax are the core of Russian shadow fleet carrying crude while Seawaymax and Handysize form the Russian shadow fleet carrying oil products.

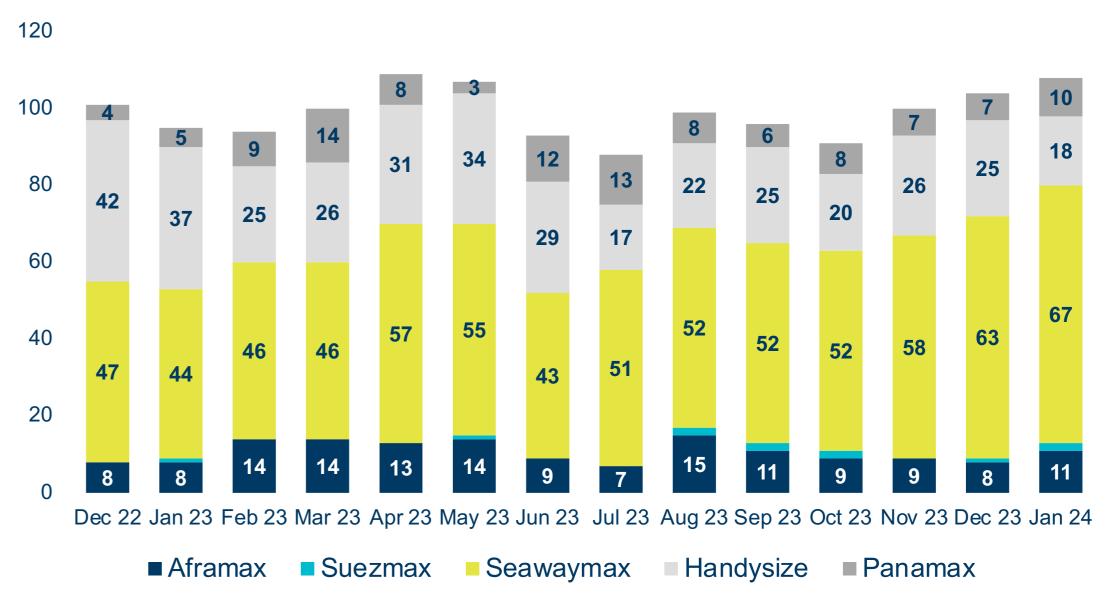
Total Russian shadow fleet carrying oil and oil products is estimated at 211 tankers – 209 left Russian ports and 2 involved in STS transfers¹ in January 2024.

The share of Russian crude oil exports by shadow fleet increased by around 7% MoM to 78% in January 2024

- Russian crude oil exports by shadow fleet increased by 244 kb/d or by 10% MoM to 2675 kb/d in January and its share in total crude shipments increased to 78%
- Sanctioned by the OFAC on February 8, 2024, Oil Tankers Scf Mgmt Fzco was responsible for almost a quarter of Russian crude shipments by shadow fleet while the share of previous leader, Sun Ship Management sanctioned by the OFAC on December 20, 2023, decreased from 15% in December 2023 to just 2% in January 2024

In January 2024 Russian oil products exports by shadow fleet increased by 157 kb/d and its share in total oil products shipments increased by 8%

- Russia shipped 996 kb/d or around 45% of its oil products exports by shadow fleet in January 2024
- Oil Tankers Scf Mgmt Fzco lost its the leader position of a top ship manager as its its share in total oil products shipments by shadow fleet declined from 14% to 5% MoM

Russian oil products exports by shadow fleet, kb/d

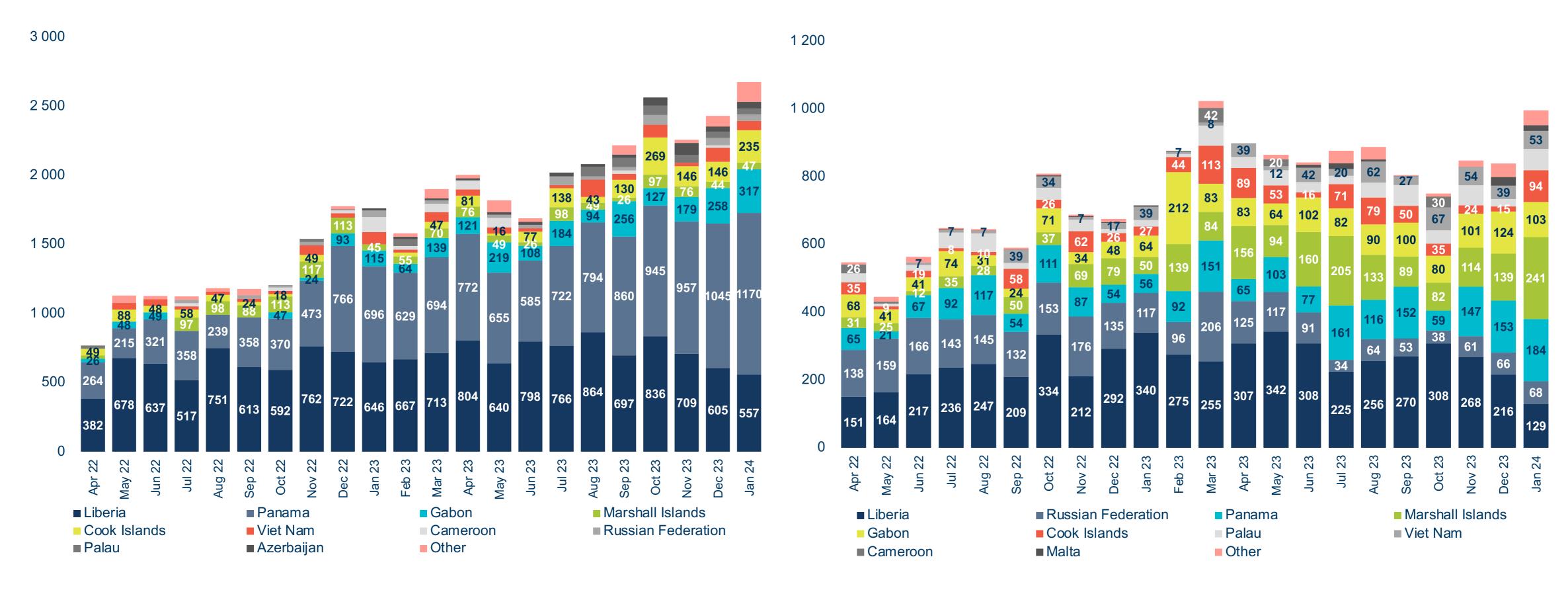

As of February 20, 2024, the US Treasury sanctions on 27 vessels carrying out Russian crude sold above the price cap effectively hit the target by removing tankers from regular commercial service

- 16 tankers from the list have been unloaded and have no scheduled voyages
- 8 tankers have been loaded but have not been moving, though 2 of them have indicated a port of unloading
- 3 tankers indicated planned shipments with no final port of destination

The sanctioned by the US Treasury vessels had to reveal their linkage to Russia after being effectively blocked

Six out of nine sanctioned by the OFAC tankers in October-December 2023 have already had changes in operations:

- 6 switched from Liberian flag to Russian one
- 2 switched the UAE ship manager to Russian one
- 2 changed registered owners to Russian entity
- 5 changed the UAE ISM managers to Russian ones

Russia attempts lowering effect of sanctions by transferring the management of tankers to newly established entities

- UAE registered Sun Ship Management (SSM), the former leader of Russian oil exports shipments by shadow fleet, managed the fleet of 83 tankers by July 15, 2023
- In July 15, 2023- December 20, 2023, SSM transferred 56 of 83 tankers to another UAE registered Oil Tankers Scf Mgmt Fzco and 1 tanker to the Russian manager South Fleet Ltd before being sanctioned by the OFAC on December 20, 2023
- Since December 20, 2023, another 18 of the 83 tankers were also transferred to the Oil Tankers Scf Mgmt Fzco. As of February, 20, 2024 SSM continues managing only 4 out of 83 formerly managed tankers
- Sanctioned by the OFAC on January 16, 2024, Oil Tankers Scf Mgmt Fzco has already transferred 4 tankers to a newly established UAE company Stream Ship Management Fzco

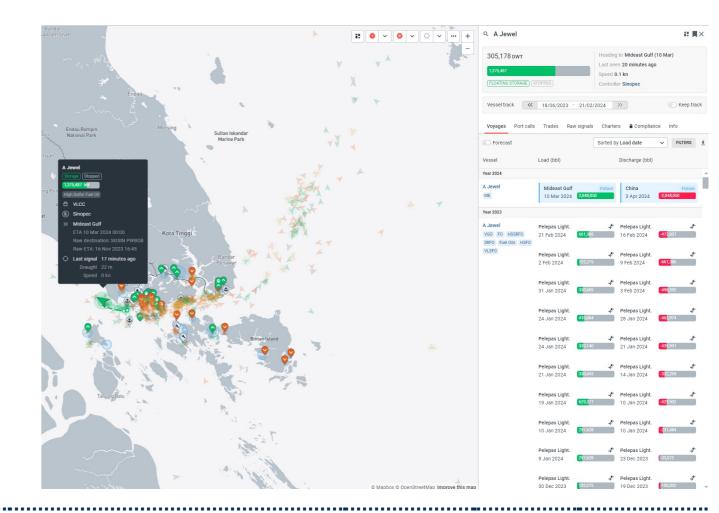

Possible breach of EU/G7 sanctions

- The IG insured floating storage A Jewel takes oil products from tankers without verifiable P&I insurance off the coast of Malaysia and then transfers it to IG insured vessels.
- Since the end of December 2023, five tankers with opaque insurance of indeterminant quality unloaded Russian and probably Iranian fuel oil and VGO to A Jewel which was later transshipped to IG insured tankers.

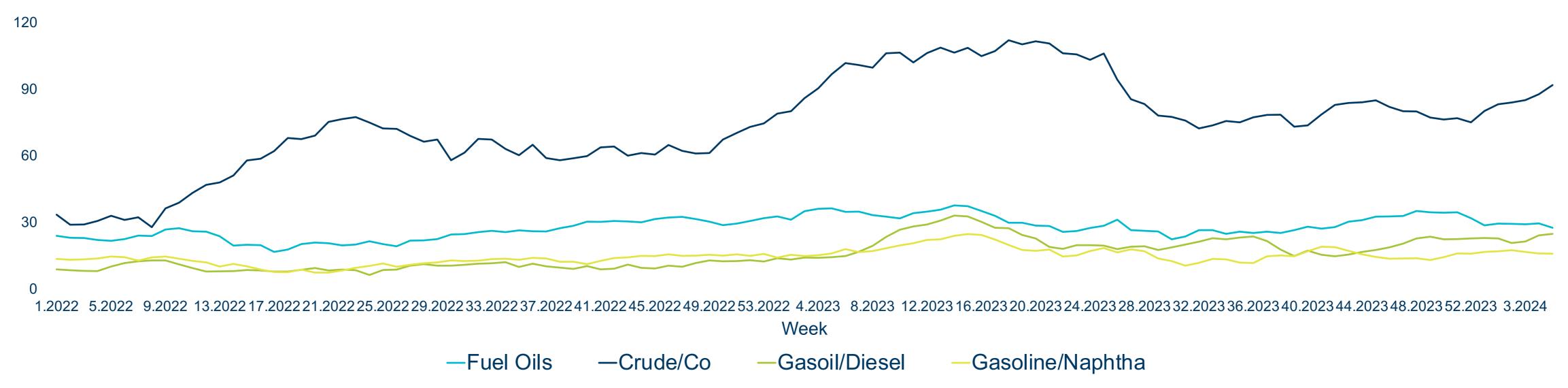

Rerouting of Russian crude and oil products to new destinations increased Russian oil on water by around 79 mb compared to the pre-invasion average

- Rerouting of Russian crude and oil products to new destinations have significantly increased Russian oil on water
- In January 2024, the volume of Russian oil on water was around 79 mb higher than the pre-invasion average
- Although the volumes of Russian crude and diesel on water decreased in January compared to their peaks after the introduction of oil embargo by the EU, they were around 2.8 and 2.6 times higher respectively compared to January 2022

Russian oil on water, mb, average per week



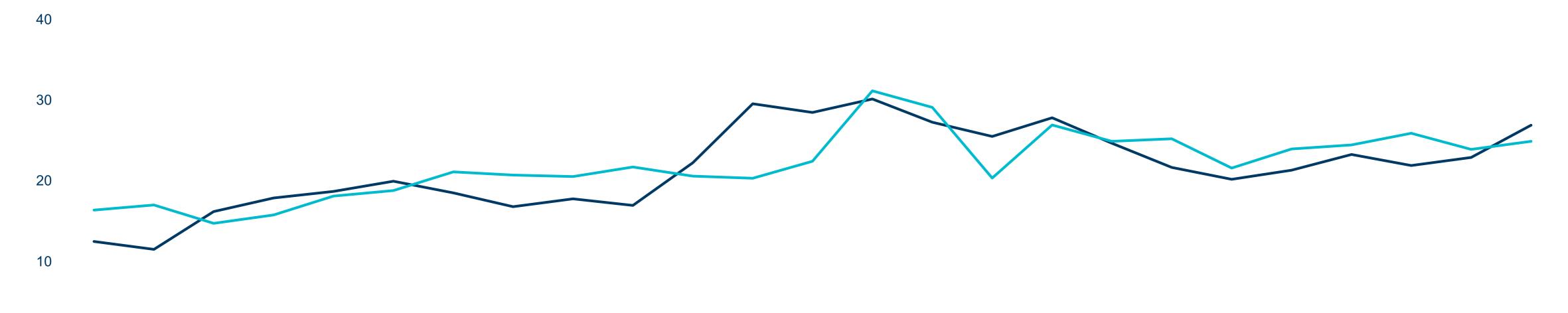

In January 2024 average transit days of crude and oil products increased by 115% and 52% respectively compared to January 2022

- Rerouting crude oil from Europe to mostly India and China increased the average transit days for crude oil from 12 in January 2022 to 30 in February 2023 but decreased to 23 in December 2023. In January 2024, the figure jumped to 27, the highest level since March 2023
- The average transit days for oil products increased from 16 in January 2022 to 31 in January 2023 but declined to 25 in January 2024

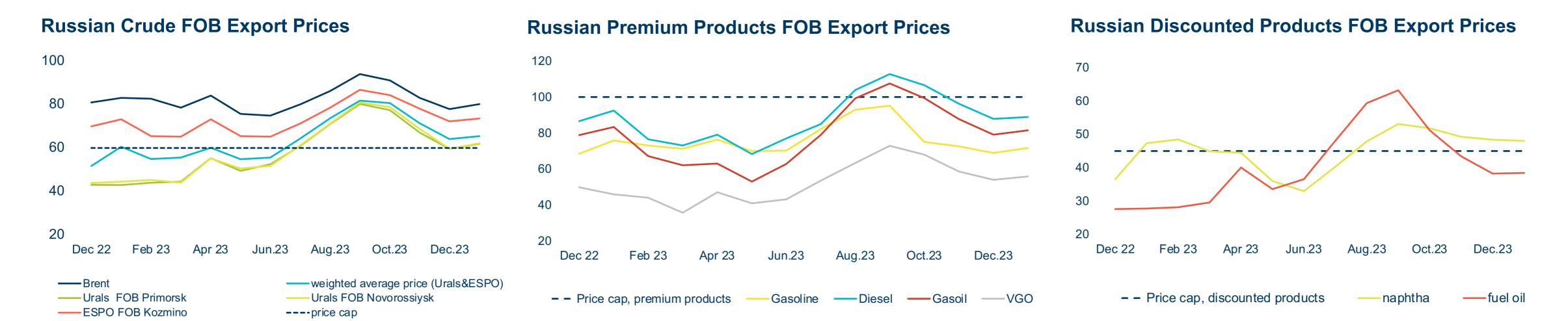

In January 2024, Urals FOB Baltic and Black Sea fell by \$2.3/bb and \$2.5/bb respectively while ESPO FOB decreased by \$1.4/bbl. The discount of Urals to Dated Brent barely changed while the discount of ESPO widened by \$1/bbl

- In January 2024, Urals FOB Baltic and Black Sea increased by 2.3/bbl and 2.5/bbl to around \$62/bbl
- The discount on Urals FOB Baltic and Black Sea little changed MoM and was estimated at around \$18/bbl .The freight rates from Primorsk to West Coast India stayed flat at around \$12/bbl since December after the gradual increase to this level from \$7.4/bbl in early October
- ESPO FOB increased by \$1.4/bbl to \$73.6/bbl while the discount to Dated Brent widened by around \$1/bbl MoM
- Prices for Russian diesel increased to \$88.9/bbl to around \$11.1/bbl below price cap. The price of gasoline increased by \$1.7/bb to \$71.6/bbl while
 gasoil increased by \$2.4/bbl to \$81.5/bbl MoM. The price of VGO which had to be placed to discounted products instead of the premium ones
 increased by \$1.8/bbl to \$558/bbl MoM in January
- Price for fuel oil and naphtha little changed MoM. The average price of naphtha has exceeded the approved price cap for discounted products at \$45/bbl since August 2023

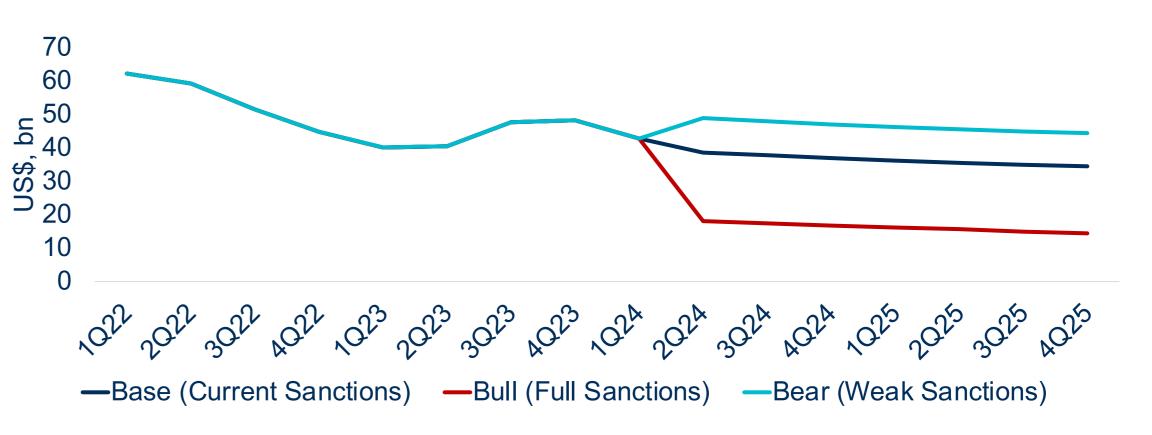
In January 2024 Russian oil export revenues increased by \$0.3 bn to \$15.6bn. KSE Institute projects that revenues will contract to still robust \$156 bn and \$141 bn in 2024 and 2025 respectively in the base case scenario from \$218 bn in 2022 and estimated \$177 bn in 2023, but the scenario outcome is sensitive to sanctions enforcement

- Although volumes of Russian oil exports marginally changed since the invasion as it was able to redirect exports to other markets proposing steep discounts, the decline in the world oil prices and steep discount on Russian oil resulted in a sharp fall in Russian oil revenues in 1H2023. Narrowing the discount on Russian oil and soaring world market prices led to a surge of Russian oil revenues until November when the trend has been reversed for both prices and discount.
- Russian oil export revenues increased by \$0.3 bn (MOM) to \$15.6 bn in January as all Russian crude grades gained a little while exports volumes of crude and product remained broadly unchanged.
- The KSE Institute projects that in the base case with current oil price caps and status quo of sanctions but their stronger enforcement, revenues will contract to \$156 bn and \$141 bn in 2024 and 2025 respectively compared to \$218 bn and estimated \$177 bn in 2022n and 2023 respectively. Total Russian oil exports goes down to 7.0 mb/d.
- In the bull sanctions case, with lower price cap equivalent to \$50/bbl discount to forecast Brent prices, revenues fall to \$95 bn and \$61 bn in 2024 and 2025 respectively.
 Total Russian oil exports goes down to 55.7 mb/d in this scenario.
- In the bear case, with US\$ 10/bbl discount to forecast Brent prices, and less decline in oil export volumes, revenues will increase to robust \$187 bn and \$181 bn in 2024 and 2025 respectively. Total Russian oil exports only goes down to to 7.4 mb/d in this scenario.

Policy Recommendations

Bold measures are needed as Russia's oil is slipping beyond G7 reach.

The October-November data suggest that problems with price cap implementation and enforcement are much bigger than previously expected. To ensure that sanctions continue to constrain Russia's ability to wage its war of aggression on Ukraine—and that their credibility is maintained—additional steps urgently need to be taken. Below, we outline three critical measures that can quickly and effectively address Russian effort to evade sanctions on its oil exports.

- 1. G7/EU countries should ensure that their authorities have sufficient proof of compliance with the price cap, including by: a) leveraging the involvement of G7/EU financial institutions in the Russian oil trade and their knowledge of key transaction details such as prices; b) requiring attestations to be provided by reputable entities defined via transparent criteria and subject to sanctions in the case of violations or their facilitation; and/or c) stepping-up of documentary evidence requirements for G7/EU service providers under the current system (including original sales contracts, etc.).
- 2. EU coastal states should leverage geographical "choke points" to limit Russia's use of a "shadow fleet" of tankers by requiring proper spill insurance for vessels' passage through their territorial waters, including in the Baltic Sea and Mediterranean. This would force Russia to rely once again on G7/EU services for a substantial share of its exports and also help address environmental risks that have emerged due to the increasing use of old and under-insured tankers. For this purpose, a system to allow for timely and efficient verification of insurance information should be established.
- 3. Price cap coalition countries should step up penalties on entities that violate the price cap. For G7/EU companies, this should include tougher monetary penalties and expanded lockout periods. For third-country actors, price cap coalition countries should impose "direct" sanctions (e.g., SDN listing in the United States or use of the European Union's anti-circumvention tool established in the 11th package) and consider the application of extraterritorial ("secondary") sanctions, leveraging the continued critical importance of its financial system for internationally operating businesses.
